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Dehumanization ("D")

• Current literature— Three meanings: a. "D" in ref. to complex psychosocial processes (e.g., technology, modern medicine, computers, etc.); b. "D" as a state of mind, i.e., feeling of being dehumanized (e.g., unwanted sexual advances); c. "D" as a psychological process, i.e., what makes man's aggression towards man possible.

Dehumanization -- definition

- Depriving humans of human quality, personality, spirit, or life
- Contexts: 1. "D" in psychosocial situations
 (e.g., as a process: technology, etc.; as a
 state of mind); 2. Adaptive dehumanization;
 3. "D" in pathological narcissism
 (Narcissistic Dehumanization Type I and
 Type II, e.g., as part of aggression and
 violence)

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
